#### Department of Nursing Special Admission Requirements

# In addition to meeting university admissions criteria, applicants must:

- Have a baccalaureate degree with a major in Nursing from an accredited nursing program in a regionally-accredited college or university;
- Have completed the following undergraduate courses or their equivalent: Nursing Research, Nursing Health Assessment and Statistics;
- Have a current and valid license as a registered nurse;
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher in all undergraduate courses and a GPA of 3.0 or higher with a grade of "C" or better in all upperdivision nursing courses. Applicants who do not meet the GPA requirements or who have graduated from non-graded baccalaureate programs may be conditionally admitted. A GPA of 3.0 must be maintained for the first nine hours of work completed. If a 3.0 GPA is not maintained, the student must petition the Nursing program for continued enrollment.

Applicants with degrees from countries other than the United States must have their international transcripts evaluated by a NACES (http://www.naces.org/members.html) approved agency, unless the applicant is affiliated with one of Governors State University's recruiting agencies - INDUS or College Study US. If applicant is affiliated with a GSU recruiting agency, an in-house evaluation will be performed by a Foreign Credential Evaluator in the Office of International Services. Applicants must assume all responsibility for fees associated with testing and evaluating. All required credentials must be on file in the Office of Admissions before an applicant can be admitted to the program.

### **Other Requirements**

Once accepted into the program, information regarding health and other program specific requirements will be sent to the student. These requirements must be met prior to enrollment.

### **Degree Requirements**

# Students must meet all university requirements for a master's degree. In addition, students must:

- During the last semester of the program, pass a comprehensive examination and/or presentation over the major area of study as determined by faculty. This examination/presentation will be evaluated by graduate faculty. It may be repeated only once;
- A student must earn a grade of B or better in all clinical courses.
- A student may repeat ONLY (1) nursing course in which a grade of "C" or below is received. A second
- "C" or below will result in dismissal from the program.
