APICS - Basics of Supply Chain Management

Basics of Supply Chain Management is an introductory course for production and inventory management personnel and CPIM candidates. This course provides basic definitions and concepts for planning and controlling the flow of materials into, through, and out of an organization. This updated course emphasizes the relationships among activities and functions that occur in the supply chain as goods, services, and information move from vendors/suppliers on the supply-side of the chain to the customers/consumers on the demand-side of the chain. In addition, the course addresses types of manufacturing systems, demand management and forecasting, master planning, material requirements planning, capacity management, production activity control, purchasing, inventory management, physical distribution, quality management, lean/just-in-time manufacturing, and the theory of constraints.

Register to join the GSU Concert Chorale! Formerly known as the South Suburban Chorale this 100+ member chorus will be filling the halls of GSU with beautiful music as it continues to establish itself as one of the premiere singing ensembles of the Chicago Southland.

Under the direction of Albert M. Jackson, the Chorale has performed in concerts throughout the Chicago south suburbs and Northwest Indiana presenting major works such as Beethoven's *Ninth Symphony*, Carl Orff's *Carmina Burana*, Mozart's *Grand Mass in C minor*, Mendelssohn's *Hymn of Praise*, the Brahms *Requiem*, and in recent seasons the Mozart *Requiem* and Bernstein's *Mass* with the Illinois Philharmonic. Most recently, members of the Chorale joined the Lakeshore Symphony Orchestra for a performance of Mahler's *Second Symphony*.
