Dear Dual Degree Program Students, Alumni, and Supporters!

Spring semester is upon us, which means – it is already time to start planning for fall! As you know, DDP students can compete for scholarships that cover their *full* tuition and fees if they choose to attend GSU: the **GSU Promise Scholarship** and **DDP Honors Scholarship**. These are *only* available to DDP students. The scholarship application deadline for those transferring in Fall, 2018 is February 16, 2018. DDP students: APPLY TODAY! Illinois Dreamers are also encouraged to apply for the GSU Promise Scholarship for the chance to earn a \$600 book stipend for four semesters. The selection committee reads through every application thoroughly and takes many factors into consideration. We encourage all DDP students to apply, even if you have never received a scholarship, have never held a leadership position, etc. You can also contact your DDP Transfer Specialist and/or a Student Transition Assistant (STA) if you need help applying.

Important Events and Updates

Fall 2018 DDP Scholarship Applications due February 16th

DDP students, would you like to attend GSU for FREE? If you are transferring to GSU in Fall, 2018, make sure to apply for the [GSU Promise Scholarship](#) and/or the [DDP Honors Scholarship](#). These scholarships are only available to DDP students, so you have less competition than with other scholarships. Students who qualify for both are encouraged to apply for both, although students may only be awarded one or the other.

The GSU Promise Scholarship is a competitive scholarship for DDP students who receive the Federal Pell Grant and have at least a 2.75 GPA. It covers full tuition and fees and a book stipend for up to four semesters at GSU (excluding summers). The DDP Honors Scholarship is a competitive scholarship for DDP students who are current members of their community college Honors Program or chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Honor Society and have at least a 3.5 GPA. It covers full tuition and fees at GSU for up to four semesters (excluding summers). If you are a Chicago STAR scholar, you may also be eligible for the DDP Chicago STAR Scholars Scholarship. It is open to DDP students who are enrolled in the Chicago STAR Scholars program, are active members of their community college Honors Program or chapter of Phi Theta Kappa Honors Society, and have a 3.25 GPA or above. There are two (2) scholarship categories: one scholarship award covers \$1,000 for books/campus dining for a maximum of four (4) semesters (excluding summers); and the other covers \$7,200 annually for campus housing for a maximum of two (2) years (excluding summers). Applications, recommendation forms, and FAQs can be found on the [GSU Office of Financial Aid](#) site. Application materials are due on **Friday, February 16, 2018!**

DDP & MSI Career Mini-Conference

On Friday, March 2, 2018, the Dual Degree Program will join the Male Success Initiative in hosting its fifth annual Career Mini-Conference (previously titled 'Get Jobs: Career Symposium') from 12:00pm to 5:00pm on the Governors State University campus. During the conference, students will be provided with helpful resources to aid in being successful in their pursuits of a new job, internship, etc. Each session will cover a different topic related to job search preparation, career development, and resources available at GSU to achieve your dream job. Workshops will be offered in two tracks: one track for first-time attendees, and one track featuring new workshops for students who have attended this symposium before. All students are asked to dress as they would for an interview. Don't miss out on this great opportunity! Be sure to check your email for the sign-up link!

STA Spotlight – Public Health Brigade Trip to Nicaragua

While DDP students have the opportunity to participate in monthly community service events, one DDP Student Transition Assistant took things a bit further over his winter break. Antoine Hawkins chose to spend his time, along with a group of GSU students and faculty, traveling to Nicaragua and bringing necessary sanitation facilities to a small village. When asked what inspired Antoine to participate, he said, *“I would say I have a heart of service, I believe that is why I am a Social Work major and why I chose to go serve in Nicaragua. Being a part of the Dual Degree Program we have an opportunity to volunteer and give back to our local community. However, this trip was different. Although I have had the opportunity to give back I have never experienced it on this level. I have heard that service learning projects gives students the opportunity to fully immerse themselves in the culture and truly learn what is important to not only the families you are serving, but the community at large. This was definitely something I wanted to experience first-hand.”*

Antoine also said that while in Nicaragua he learned more than he thought he would. *“I learned the true meaning of humility, gratitude, and humanity. Nothing else really matters. Imagine not having the comforts of hitting a switch and lights come on, or going to a sink and have running water, how about something as simple as enjoying a simple cube of ice in a drink on a 90 plus degree day. Going on this trip right after the Holiday Season really put things into perspective for me. I was able to examine my life and take inventory on events and decisions I have made thus far. This trip allowed me to see my own life with clarity.”*

If you are thinking about participating in a service learning trip, Antoine says, *“Don’t say you want to do it. Do it! It will change your life.”*
