Resources for Low-income Families

Chicago Uptown Ministry is a Chicago Illinois charity that offers gifts, toys, winter coats and food to the low income and poor. The program relies exclusively on donations from the community. Nothing that you contribute will go towards administrative expenses. Some of what may be distributed is as follows.

Families will get free bags of groceries, including hams, turkeys, canned fruits and vegetables, and more. Games, toys, and other gifts may be passed out by the ministry, based on donation levels.
