By now you've probably heard about the newly formed Male Success Initiative, an enrichment program for male students of color.


The goal of the MSI is to provide opportunities for professional, academic, and personal development, while impacting retention and graduation rates.

Guest Policy Information

As a Prairie Place resident you will have the opportunity to check in guests to visit you while you are in the building. Please read through the points below that detail information about our guest policy:

- All guests of Prairie Place are responsible for knowing and complying with University Housing policies and standards.
- Guests must be escorted by their host at all times.
- All guests must sign out the Prairie Place Main
 Desk at the conclusion of their visit and turn in their guest pass.
- Guests must registers themselves at the front desk each day they will stay in the building past midnight regardless if they
