

Associate of Arts to Bachelor of Arts in Psychology

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Morton College (MC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Psychology degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from MC and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree in Psychology from GSU.
