

Associate of Arts to Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology & Sociology

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Kankakee Community College (KCC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Anthropology and Sociology degree program based on the catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from KCC and a Bachelors of Arts (BA) degree in Anthropology and Sociology from GSU.
