

Associate of Arts to Bachelor Health Science in Communication Disorders

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between Joliet Junior College (JJC) and Governors State University (GSU) for the Communication Disorders degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from JJC and a Bachelors of Health Science (BHS) degree in Communication Disorders from GSU. **In addition to meeting the GSU admission criteria, students must have a grade point average of at least 2.75 for the last 60 hours of undergraduate course work attempted.**
