

Associates of Arts to Bachelors of Health Science in Communication Disorders

The following is presented as an articulation agreement between City Colleges of Chicago (CCC) and GSU for the Communication Disorders degree program based on the current catalogs of both schools. The student would receive an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from one of the CCC and Bachelors of Health Science (BHS) degree in Communication Disorders from Governors State University (GSU). **In addition to meeting the GSU admission criteria, students must have a grade point average of at least 2.75 for the last 60 hours of undergraduate course work attempted.**
