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Admission Requirements

- Have a GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Admitting occurs three times a year. Completed applications must be received by June 15 for the fall term; October 15 for the spring term; and March 15 for the summer term.

Degree Requirements

- Students must meet all university requirements for a bachelor's degree.
- All required courses and the upper-division electives must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.
- A minimum of 150 hours of field experience must be successfully completed.
- A mandatory criminal background check must be completed by all students prior to the start of an Internship. Conviction of a felony or any attempt to commit a felony will preclude eligibility for Internship and completion of the program.
- All students must complete a candidacy exam and a pre-graduation survey.
