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# Recovery Oriented Systems of Care (ROSC)

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ROSC is a coordinated network of community-based services and supports that is person-centered and builds on the strengths and resiliencies of individuals, families, and communities to achieve recovery and improved health, wellness, and quality of life for those with or at risk of substance use disorders.

- ROSC councils are a practice model that focuses on empowering individuals to take control of their recovery processes and pathways through councils.
- ROSC councils are important to help foster an efficient framework of agencies, organizations, individuals, and providers to address the varied, often complicated needs of those seeking recovery.
