What have we been doing?

There was a Drug Endangered Children and Human Trafficking training hosted by the Clark and Cumberland County ROSC at the Church of God in Casey, Illinois on July 18th. Liesl Wingert presented.

There were 14 people who attended the training with a variety of professions being represented such as teachers, people in recovery, SACIS, Bikers Against Child Abuse (BACA), and a local area Health Department.

Overdoses

We are looking for more places in Clark and Cumberland County to have Narcan display sites. In 2023 alone, there have been 3 meth/fentanyl deaths in Cumberland County back in February according to Cumberland's Coroner. There has been an alarming amount of non-fatal overdoses in Clark County being called in each month.

The reality is that it is in our backyard, and this is why it is so important to get Narcan into as many hands as possible. Please be thinking of people that you know who own businesses or work for agencies within Clark and Cumberland that would be willing to have these sites. This can potentially save someone's life.

As a ROSC we have been working to get at least one display site (the goal is as many as possible) per town in the counties that we work in for people to take in a discrete manner. There are currently still gaps though. We are lacking DOPP sites in Martinsville, West Union, Clarksville, and Westfield in Clark County and Jewett in Cumberland County. Stigma has been a huge barrier but with the help of the ROSC Council then we can work together towards filling these gaps and removing these barriers!

There was an overdose reported in one of these towns on 7/30 so there is definitely a need that must be addressed in these towns!



The Importance of Remembering

August 31st is National Overdose Awareness Day. Oftentimes when a friend or family member passes away due to an overdose, it can leave those close to the individual with questions, much pain, and many "what-ifs." It is something that may make the news and touch the communities' hearts for a time, but it can eventually fade to the back of many people's minds, but the friends and family will always remember the individual who they loved that lost their battle with addiction. You are not alone! We as a ROSC believe in the importance of supporting the loved ones of those who have passed and honoring their memory.

On August 31st. there will be a Candlelight Vigil held at the gazebo at Fairview Park in Casey, Illinois to host a memorial service for those who did not make it out of addiction alive.

The Vigil will go from 6:30-8pm. To remember those who have passed, there will be a table set up to put their picture on along with a list of names that will be read. If you plan to attend and have lost a loved one, either bring a picture of them to the event or email it to Kristina or Kyle and they will print it off.

There will be a guest speaker, Amanda R., who will be sharing her experience with overdoses and give hope to those in attendance!

After the speaker there will be the lighting of candles, reading of the names of those lost, and then a moment of silence followed by a time of prayer.
