- Last Saturday there was a presentation of Generation Found at the Lincoln Movie Theater. There was great conversation with a group of people who left wanting to learn more about recovery high schools.

New Business:

- There will be a showing of Generation Found in Mason City on Saturday, March 23rd at the Arlee Theater. The movie will be at 1:00 p.m.
- According to the CDC, harm reduction is "a public health approach that focuses on mitigating the harmful consequences of drug use, including transmission of infectious disease and

prevention of overdose, through provision of care that is intended to be free of stigma and centered on the needs of people who use drugs.”

- Break-out rooms were conducted in order to address how the council would respond to the following questions/statements: “When you going to install the free chemo station for cancer patients?” (Harm Reduction Vending Machines); “Let’s feed into the problem instead of solving the problem.” (Syringe Access Resources); “Just let them die.” (Recovery Supports)

Reminders/Recovery Resources:

- Updated Logan/Mason County Recovery Meetings flyers and cards are available. We are trying to pass along good, accurate information. If you, your agency, or someone you know needs these, they are available on business-size cards and also 5x7 cards. Please feel free to reach out to Jeanette to request the flyers and cards; they can be dropped off or mailed to you. The more we can get these flyers and cards out, the more people will be able to utilize them.
- The Harm Reduction Vending Machine at Family Custom Cleaners has harm reduction resources available.
- The Logan County Health Department has harm reduction resources available. The Sharps Drop-Off is also available at the health department.
- Havana Public Library now has some harm reduction options available.
- The Mason County Health Department now has harm reduction options available.

On-Going Projects:

- For the Logan County Health Needs Assessment, there were 428 people who have completed it. The survey results ended with youth mental health and substance use being the top two priorities, which is common compared to what the assessment revealed in the past. Substance use is the number one priority/concern. Molly has some work to do with the Advisory Board in April to solidify things. There have been nine or ten focus groups throughout the community. The results in the focus groups seem to be aligning with the top priorities. The top priorities will be decided with the Advisory Board, and then the next three years will be implementing different interventions to address the issues.
- Community Action is having a “Cheeseburgers in Paradise” fundraiser. It will be on April 27th from 6:00 p.m. – 10:00 p.m. It is great for your team, family, and friends.
- The Recovery in Action subcommittee meets every 2nd Tuesday of the month at the Hope of Fifth building in Lincoln. The next meeting is April 9th at 4:30 p.m. This is for anyone who is interested in getting involved (people with lived experience, allies, etc.).
- Lincoln Memorial Hospital will have Trauma-Informed Care Training at the hospital from 4:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. on June 20th. There are two CEs that you receive if you stay for the whole event.
- For the Ford County ROSC, the Second Annual All Awareness Day is scheduled for May 11th from 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. It’s a powder paint run with food trucks. A lot of booths will be there to bring awareness for the many different causes and resources.

- Fulton-Mason Crisis Service added two more staff members, so they are able to staff their Mason County office a lot more; they are more available during the week. There is a Hats Off to Hope and Healing annual fundraiser on Friday, April 26th from 5:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. at Spoon River College multi-purpose building.
