Challenges

- Monetary without donations, grants, and a sustainability plan we cannot continue to save lives
- Stigma without open minds, people will continue to die because our work won't be valued
- Legislative without sensible and effective local, state, and federal policies, our missions fulfillment will be limited
- Quality care accessibility and availability without treatment programming focused on helping
 the individual from an evidence based biopsychosocial standpoint, we will struggle to identify
 supportive partners to assist the populations we serve
- **IV.** Guest Speaker: Renee Luthe from Foundations Center a generalized substance use disorder treatment center with a location in Loves Park and Belvidere

Provide hybrid, in person, and virtual services

Self-pay but have reasonable payment options and can work with individuals that are struggling significantly

Level 1 generalized outpatient treatment for substance use disorder and intensive outpatient treatment. Program length and frequency is dependent on patient needs

Primary population: DUI education for individuals arrested for DUIs

- Work with Secretary of State
- Partnerships with agencies surrounding individuals obtaining license after establishing and meeting needs for recovery time
- Provide partner abuse intervention programming
 - Treat the aggressor that has been arrested for domestic violence
 - Partner with judicial court system
 - In person and self-pay
- Anger Management
 - Understanding emotional regulation

Without referral what is process if the individual calls for help:

- Make initial outreach call to Foundations Center
- Come into Fill out paperwork
- Meet with counselor to identify specific needs
- Typically able to see individuals the week after the call

Foundation Center does not offer transportation services but can connect individuals with those who can offer those services

V. Events and Trainings: Discussed the past January events and the upcoming events in February. NA convention hosted a fundraising event at EDDR on 1/27/24. The event was successful and had a large turnout. Looking to continue to partner with Anonymous groups for future events. On 2/24/24 there will be a Chili Cookoff from 12-4 at EDDR.
