 - a. Respondents
 - i. 28 total respondents, 92.86% were cisgender female.
 - ii. 96.43% White
 - iii. 100% Non-Hispanic
 - iv. 28.57% had a high school education tied with 28.57% having a Bachelor'sDegree
 - v. Most respondents were 35 or older.
 - vi. One-third of respondents are social service providers.
 - b. Is Substance Use a medical condition?
 - i. 46.43% Yes
 - ii. 3.57% No
 - iii. 50% Sometimes

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- c. What do you consider to be the top three (3) substances being used in your area?
 - i. 89.29% Methamphetamine
 - ii. 82.14% Opioids
 - iii. 67.86% Alcohol
- d. Based on your experiences, where do you think substances are readily accessed in your area? Please select all that apply.
 - i. 78.57% Friends
 - ii. 75% Drug Dealers
 - iii. 57.14% Family Members
 - iv. 25.57% Prescriptions from Medical Professionals
- e. How easy is it for you to obtain substances in your area?
 - i. 55.56% Under four hours
 - ii. 25.93% within 24 hours
 - iii. 18.52% within a few days
- f. How quickly could someone access substance use treatment services in your area?
 - i. 46.15% More than One Week
 - ii. 34.62% Within Three Days
 - iii. 15.38% One Week
 - iv. 3.85% Same Day
