### **Introduction:**

Today's meeting, hosted by Vawnshekia Oklah, is presented as a roundtable discussion. Ms. Oklah begins by stating the agenda and recapping last month's meeting with Patrice Beamon.

# **Participant Roundtable Address:**

- Ms. Oklah discusses the community assessment survey results.
- Reiterates the agenda and 3CordsStrong's mission.
- Prompts discussion:
  - o How can we approach recovery in a holistic manner?
  - o How can we support each other in the community of recovery?

### Recap:

- Training on Narcan and its distribution within the community.
  - o Indicators of overdose: ashy grey skin (darker skin tones), blue lips (lighter skin tones), gasping for air; unresponsiveness.
  - o Use Narcan even if expired; protected by the Good Samaritan Laws.
- Current Community Needs:
  - o Presented via PowerPoint.
  - o Key findings: Need for better jobs, housing for homelessness, and recovery.
  - o Discussion on addressing disparities.
- Calling for Volunteers
- Becoming aware and practicing the Different Pathways to Recovery
- Family Guidance Center (Methadone Recovery Van Recovery on Wheels)

### **Bright Star Community Outreach:**

- Raven Ewing, Trauma/Behavior Health Department:
  - o 4 free mental health support groups:
    - 1. Care Room Advocates (High School/Youth)
    - 2. Help Line Advocate (833-Turn-123) Peer to Peer Help
    - 3. Family & Advocacy Center
    - Various classes: Parenting, Anger Management, Therapy, etc.
    - 4. Ambassadors

- Outreach and advocacy during crises (fires, shootings, etc.)
- \$500 raffle for entering to complete a 6-month, stipend Violence Prevention Study.

# **Chaplin Eric Knowles - Cook County Jail:**

- Discusses his road to recovery and his observation of suppression of anger by black men in and out of jail.
- Personal history with marijuana drug abuse starting in high school and leading to heroin and cocaine use in college.
- Shares experiences of guilt and attempt of suicide but emphasizes healing and restoration by GOD.

### 3rd District/Youth District Police:

#### • Officer Harris:

- o Expresses desire for reduced violence and increased community support.
- o Invites attendees to the 3rd District meetings (in-person and via Zoom).
- o Discusses prejudices faced by participants when interacting with officers.
- o Meaningful discussion on appropriate responses during police encounters.
- Officer Harris and Attorney Carolyn Howard discuss:
  - Reasonable Suspicion vs. Probable Cause from police and legal perspectives.
  - Civilian Right's to record when stopped by officers.

### **Key Takeaways:**

- Obey lawful orders given by officers.
- Do not resist arrest.
- Right to remain silent; must follow commands.
- Being detained is different from being arrested.
- Officers must inform you if you are under arrest.
- Reporting an officer: Various groups like COPLA, BIA, OIG, and State Police handle complaints.

**Closing:** Ms. Oklah thanked all the speakers and distributed Fentanyl testers, Narcans, and other resources.
