3. Presentation- Sheena Langhauser, MSW, LSW, Program Coordinator – Medical Stabilization Memorial Hospital Belleville

She is a Clinton County Resident. Medical Stabilization started 1 year ago. They average 64 referrals a month. They have a Peer Recovery Support Teams. Referrals come through doctor offices, self referrals, medical teams, ER, Individuals in withdrawl and seeking help. Agenda to schedule detox must have medical criteria-Alcohol, Poly Substance, Opiod, Benzo and other circumstances. Peers available Monday through Friday-admitting through the ER. Detox program-admitted into the hospital. This is considered a medical need-all inclusive to other patients. 1 page agreement form. No smoking or vaping allowed. Patient must stay on the Unit Floor. Goal is to rest and work on Recovery. They can bring clothes, packages food, electronics (must all be checked). No visitors are allowed. They will provide resources-Chestnut, Gateway, Comprehensive. They provide vivitrol on the last day of discharge. Suboxene is provided. Can take whatever insurance accepts. Helps to provide primary care providers. Beds are almost always available. They do Stigma trainings with all staff. They can provide transportation to further treatment by Medicar, Peers, Taxis etc. We can give referrals for people to call down and talk to peer coaches. They provide resource packets. Telehealth link or mental illness. They will only maintain Methodone if a person is already established. No geographic limit.







### In-Person Meeting at Bond County Health Department Every Tuesday at 6 p.m and Every Wednesday at 10 a.m.

SMART Recovery advocates choice, so that those seeking recovery can choose what works best for them from a tool-box of methods and strategies.

The goal of SMART Recovery is for you to achieve a health, positive and balanced lifestyle and to "move on" when you feel confident your addictive behavior is behind you, rather than remaining a permanent participant in the program. Graduates are invited to volunteer as meeting facilitators or to volunteer in other roles to help "give back to our recovery community."

#### Example of tools

Change Plan Worksheet: This is a chart on which you list your goals, how to attain them, ways in which to overcome obstacles and challenges, etc.

Cost/Benefit Analysis (CBA): This tool is especially useful for increasing motivation to abstain from addictive behaviors.

Role Playing/Rehearsing: This tool is used to rehearse how to avoid addictive behavior at high-risk upcoming events.
