#### Presentation By:

Quianya Enge, Founder and Executive Director, Beyond the Walls-The Movement, spoke about what they are doing in the community and how they are helping individuals better their futures through restorative justice work, job training opportunities, education, and making a way for those who have been negatively impacted by having a previous criminal history. BTW is re-entry link for individuals in Southern Illinois, they do peer to peer recommendations to viable resources. They are also positively impacting the community by co-hosting events with other community organizations and helping to limit barriers to end permanent punishments for those formerly impacted by incarceration.

Quianya was previously incarcerated for 11 years in the IDOC and Today, she is working inside IDOC piloting a trauma informed re-entry program! She is very motivated in the work she does because she has experienced and overcome many barriers herself when it has come to creating her own future. She is also the Regional Coordinator for the CHOICE Program inside Pinckneyville and Menard prisons and is looking for individuals interested in going into the IDOC to help volunteer as they will be offering a FREE Trauma Informed Restorative Justice training to those individuals before volunteering.

  - we had the most involvement
- 10/11 DuQuoin Wonder Wash:
  - Not very busy but one man was there who's niece struggles with opiate addiction. We gave him enough Narcan for his family to have in case she overdoses at any of their homes. The entire family

worries about her and has frequent contact with her so this was amazing to be able to do!!

- 10/17 Pinckneyville Library
  - Not much activity but one woman was there who lives in an apartment complex who said people struggle with substance use there so we gave her some flyers to hang up. This morning I personally received a phone call from a woman who saw one of those flyers and is recently in recovery looking for an NA meeting so I was able to give her that information!!!
  - We also scheduled our 1<sup>ST</sup> Narcan training for Perry County on 11/7 at the library!

Next "Pop-Up" is scheduled for 11/19 @ Elkville Public Library.
