Gateway was founded in 1968 on the south side of Chicago. They now have 16 Alcoholic/Substance Use Centers. They also have community outreach recovery services.

\*CORS Grant-Awarded to 14 organizations in Illinois through Opioid Grant Funding due to the mass pharmaceutical prescribing.

\*They provide resources for Harm Reduction and Suicide Prevention

\*They have a mobile team. They attend outreaches, meetings, hand out Narcan and toiletries.
