HLM Recovery R.O.S.C Will/Grundy Council Meeting Summary

The HLM Recovery R.O.S.C. Will/Grundy Council Meeting focused on the launch of a new recovery center, emphasizing the hard work and community support behind its creation. Key initiatives include a community shower for the homeless, peer support, and lived experience programs. Ben Rudolph, the technical assistant for ROSC, highlighted the importance of recovery-oriented systems and his personal journey of 21 years of sobriety. Various organizations, including Cornerstone Services, Omni Youth Services, and the Salvation Army, shared their services and upcoming events. The meeting also featured a guest speaker, Hasina Shaheed Jackson, who emphasized the power of choice and response in shaping one's life.
