<u>Community Resource Spotlight:</u> The presenter was unable to make the meeting, so Cat Hays was able to present information regarding Illinois Joining Forces. This resource is designed to connect veterans and their families with essential services in Illinois. The organization aims to connect veterans with support in areas such as education, legal aid, job training, and housing. Cat also discussed the Operation Connect-A-Vet initiative, which encourages individuals to reach out to veterans and submit requests for assistance. She elaborated on the organization's mission and its Operation Connect-A-Vet initiative.

<u>Council Meeting Discussion Topic</u>: Updates to McLean ROSC FY25 Communication & Outreach

Cat Hays led a discussion on preparing a community survey for state approval, emphasizing the need for feedback on the draft questions sent out via email. Participants were encouraged to suggest strategies for distributing the survey, which will include both paper copies and QR code flyers. Kari Knapp noted the importance of focusing on recommended strategies and locations for distribution during the breakout sessions.

Breakout Room Discussion:

- Andrea Kindseth highlighted the survey's extensive questions and the need for mental health advocacy alongside substance use support. She proposed various distribution points, including public places like the DMV and hospitals, and recommended using QR codes and flyers for outreach.
- Abby Behrens added that public spaces, such as bathroom doors and churches, could also be effective for survey placement.
- Jessica Johnson discussed strategies for distributing surveys, emphasizing the use of QR codes in high-traffic areas such as beauty shops, doctor's offices, and churches. She suggested leveraging holiday events and community organizations like the Salvation Army for outreach.
- Kelly Schwamberger raised concerns about the clarity of survey questions and proposed distributing surveys at recovery meetings.
- Adam Lovell raised concerns about the effectiveness of demographic questions in surveys, particularly regarding language barriers and survey length.

Agency Updates:

- Abby Behrens informed attendees about an open house for Brightpoint's children's room, designed for families during court visits, scheduled for tomorrow from 12 to 1 PM.
- Michelle Cope highlighted a veteran resource at the library that offers live chat support for benefits and job assistance. She also mentioned upcoming community events, including a downtown tree lighting and a holiday parade.
