Discussion Points:

1. Circle of Care Program:

- One-year, state-funded initiative led by the Illinois Family Resource Center, ROSC, and Hour House as the lead agency.
- Focus on building a network of support for children and families.
- Supported by the American Rescue Plan Act.
- Sustainability plan in place, with materials housed on the Illinois Family Resource Center website.

2. Training and Resources:

- Natural Helpers Training: Includes grief support services.
- **Threads of Hope**: Offers training tools and strategies for supporting children and families dealing with grief and substance use disorder (SUD).
- CEUs may be available for participants.
- Resource bags available for those in need, with assembly help from Coles County volunteers (goal: 14,300 bags).

3. Handle with Care Program:

• Partnership with law enforcement and schools to support vulnerable children.

• Teachers receive training to provide support after notification, without specific details about the incident.

Speaker: Patrick Miller - Faith and Recovery Congregation Program

• Faith Community Engagement:

- Provides four 1-hour trainings to certify congregations as recovery-friendly.
- Connects faith communities to recovery supports, similar to ROSC resources.
- Free training; interested churches in Mattoon and Charleston identified.
- Partnerships with Chestnut Health, envisioning church support through key stakeholders.
- Resource lists available; offers suicide prevention resources and Celebrate Recovery materials.

• Building Faith Community Support:

- Encourage local events to foster involvement (e.g., hosting a meal to discuss community needs).
- One-on-one connections and referrals are emphasized.
- Potential faith-based nonprofit grants to provide mental health and substance use support training.
- Additional Support:
 - 100 homeless resource bags prepared; looking for donations and volunteers.
 - Three drug court graduates acknowledged; CCRC seeking gifts or attendees for the graduation (Thursday at 1:30 PM).
 - Coat drive ongoing in partnership with local libraries and Elks Lodge; winter clothing donations requested.
