

The Illinois Helpline now offers medication on demand to IL residents seeking treatment for opioid use disorder (OUD) and alcohol use disorder (AUD). Medication-assisted recovery (MAR) involves the use of FDA-approved medications for treatment of OUD and AUD. Now an individual can speak directly with a provider over the phone, immediately receive a prescription or expedited, in-person appointment, and get transportation assistance to the pharmacy or clinic – all initiated through one phone call. Call or text the number above to receive help locating substance misuse treatment providers, including medication assisted treatment providers. Callers can access MAR NOW 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

**Residential Treatment** – Inpatient services is a more intense level of treatment for individuals with severe or long-term substance abuse addictions. It is appropriate for individuals that are unable to remain abstinent from alcohol or other drugs in an Out- Patient setting. It offers individuals the opportunity to focus on recovery, free from outside distractions and negative influences. Clients receive education, participate in group therapy sessions and receive private sessions with an assigned counselor while in this level of care.

Gateway Foundation Alcohol & Drug Treatment Center has residential services for adult men and women. Gateway has specialized programs for co-occurring mental health.

A 24-hour phone line is answered by a trained professional who can screen and schedule appointments, place on waitlists, or answer any questions from prospective clients or concerned family members and friends. Most insurances, no funds, Medicaid, and self-pay accepted.

Addiction treatments aim to address all aspects of substance use disorder. Gateway treats the social, behavioral, and physical elements of addiction through comprehensive care services. Depending on symptoms and circumstances, patients may receive services such as:


