Meeting Notes

1. Welcome & Consent Minutes

- Lisa welcomed all; encouraged cameras.
- August minutes: minor typos noted by Gary. Motion to approve with corrections passed.

2. Organizational Spotlight - TASC/DART (Tristan & Brandon)

Program Overview:

- TASC = Treatment Alternatives for Safe Communities.
- o DART = Deflection Avenues Reconnection Team (office based in Champaign).
- Serves 6 counties: Coles, Douglas, Vermilion, Piatt, DeWitt, McLean.

Services:

o Referrals from law enforcement/first responders for individuals with SUD.

- "Relentless engagement" continuous outreach until clients are connected with resources.
- o Supports include housing, outpatient/inpatient treatment, recovery navigation.

Referrals in Coles County:

- o Active with Mattoon PD, Charleston PD, Coles Sheriff's Office.
- Charleston PD referrals coming in but training access still limited.
- Coles Sheriff very little engagement to date.
- o Douglas County rebuilding relationship after missed referral under prior leadership.

Barriers & Needs:

- Shelter beds remain the biggest gap (often full).
- Treatment beds usually 1–2 day wait; Gateway Springfield has strong partnership.
- Leadership Meetings: 2nd Thursday monthly, 1–2 PM, via Zoom.
- **Council Support:** Lisa offered to connect DART with sheriff and Douglas County contacts to strengthen local ties.

3. BASE Program Update – "Real Talk" (Tyler Warner)

- Where/When: Mattoon Public Library, Sept 16 Nov 18, Tuesdays, 5–6 PM.
- For: Teens ages 14–19.
- Curriculum: TND (Towards No Drugs).
- **Topics:** Communication, stress, substance use myths/denial, decision-making, chemical dependency, stereotyping.
- **Interactive Elements:** Talk show role-plays, panel discussions, basketball tobacco-cessation game.
- **Incentives:** Attendance rewards each week; pizza dinner at first session.
- **Registration:** Through Mattoon Library Facebook.

4. Recovery Month Updates (September)

- Paint / Light Up the Town Purple:
 - o Landmarks: Sarah Bush Lincoln, businesses, houses.

- Local businesses featuring purple drinks: Kamikaze (taro milk tea), Jackson Avenue Coffee, Ginger Ale's.
- Community Involvement: Encouraging residents to use purple porch lights, decorate windows, and wear purple.
- **Newsletter:** September issue includes full calendar of events, resource links, and Recovery Month highlights .

5. Event Recaps & Ongoing

- Overdose Awareness Candlelight Vigil (Aug 31):
 - ~45 attendees.
 - Meaningful stories shared; supportive and moving event.
- Charleston Family Resource Fair (Sept 8–9, CHS):
 - o ROSC table and "Hidden in Plain Sight" interactive exhibit (for parents only).
 - o Goal: educate parents on warning signs of youth substance use.

6. Community Survey Relaunch

- Open to anyone who lives or works in Coles County.
- Goal: assess awareness, needs, and education priorities.
- Members asked to complete and share widely.
- Early launch this year = more time to collect data.

7. Subcommittee Launch – Foundations for Recovery

- Focus: housing, transportation, second-chance employment.
- Next steps:
 - o Invite landlords, Dial-A-Ride, deflection, and major employers.
 - o Collect employer/landlord lists.
 - Ayla shared statewide employer resource link.
- Goal: develop strategies to expand local access to housing, reliable transportation, and jobs for those in recovery.

8. MAR (Medication-Assisted Recovery) Education

- MAR Now pamphlets shared (also in newsletter).
- Plan: print for next meeting, distribute at libraries, malls, jails, and email.
- Members asked for additional ideas for distribution sites.

9. Ongoing Projects / Needs

- Homeless Awareness Bags (Nov):
 - o Goal: 100 bags.
 - o Needed: gloves, hats, hand warmers, Dial-A-Ride tokens.
 - Salvation Army partnering.
 - o DART may donate warming kits (pending approval).

Community Laundry Day:

- Rotating Charleston/Mattoon.
- Very effective for engagement and connecting people to resources.
- Cost: ~\$200–300 per event; current funds ~\$150.
- Seeking church/business sponsorships.
- Women's Hygiene Bags: Not started; Lisa to follow up with Maggie.

10. Coordinator Transition

- Lisa announced relocation to Wisconsin in October.
- New Coordinator: Skylar Miller (currently Moultrie County Coordinator).
- **Navigator:** new recovery navigator starting later this month.
- Jenna will oversee transition and support until October handoff.
