





- •Families had a blast with **paint pours, lawn games, and activities for the kids**—making the day both meaningful and fun for all ages.




Rock and Run for Mental Health

Sangamon County ROSC was excited to be part of a fun-filled community event at Rochester Community Park!



What This Clinic Sees



- > Teens (12+) and Adult Patients
- Substance Use Disorders
 - Alcohol
 - Stimulants
 - Methamphetamine, Cocaine
 - Opioids
 - Heroin, Fentanyl, Prescription Opioids, Illicit opioids
- > STAR MOM- Pregnant Patients
- Gambling Disorder

Substance Use Disorder symptoms:

- Increasing quantity / frequency of use
- Difficulty cutting back
- Continued use despite risks or negative consequences
- Increased tolerance
- Withdrawal symptoms when not using





- Patients can call SIU START directly to be assessed and scheduled
- Providers can submit referrals directly to FQHC MAT via Touchworks or Halo START staff directly
- Walk ins are welcome anytime to be assessed for START services
- Patients in other programs can be referred by their discharge planner

1st

- Active IV users
- Pregnant people
- Hospital follow-up

2nd

- Street users
- In withdrawal (can call MAR NOW to bridge medication to appointment time)

3rd

- Discharging from treatment/detox
- Transferring from other programs

First Appointment

SIU MEDICINE FORWARD, FOR YOU.

- Patient will meet with the integrated team—all during the same visit, in the same room
- First appointment takes about 1 hour

Medical Provider

- Discuss substance use disorder concerns and history
- Collaborate on treatment options

Behavioral Health Therapist

- Schedule behavioral health intake (1 hour)
- Discuss interest in individual therapy

Peer Support

- Learn about groups and resources
- Discuss case management needs

START Treatment Engagement

SIU MEDICINE FORWARD, FOR YOU.

- Starts with weekly appointments
- Needs to have 3 behavioral health engagements a month
 - Individual Therapy
 - Peer Support Groups
 - Community Meetings
 - Gateway Outpatient
 - Can be a variety of engagements, need to provide verification



Medication

SIU MEDICINE FORWARD, FOR YOU.

- There are various medications that can help manage substance use disorders and withdrawal symptoms
- > Medication is not mandatory to be part of this program
- Medications typically used in clinic:
 - > Buprenorphine
 - Sublocade
 - Brixadi
 - Naltrexone
 - Vivitrol
 - Acamprosate
 - Topiramate
 - Bupropion
