AIM HIGH and you could get up to \$24,000 toward the cost of your tuition.

- » The freshman AIM HIGH awards range from \$12,000 to \$24,000 based on four years.
- » The transfer AIM HIGH awards range from \$3,000 to \$8,000 based on two years.

OCT 1ST

Apply for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Use GSU's Federal School Code **009145**.

NOV 1ST

Apply by November 1 to be eligible for GSU Presidential, Provost, and Deans scholarships – ranging from a full ride to \$28,000 award.


