



# UI DICR: Diversity In Cancer Research Internship

## Paid Undergraduate Summer Cancer Research

The University of Illinois Diversity in Cancer Research (UI DICR) Program is inviting undergraduate students from backgrounds underrepresented\* in biomedical research to conduct their own cancer research project under the mentorship of a University of Illinois Cancer Center faculty researcher.

Students will conduct and report on their in-depth cancer research project; hear from cancer researchers; learn about healthcare disparities and ways to address them; and engage in workshops to build research and professional skills.

**Full-time undergraduates** entering their sophomore, junior, or senior year at University of Illinois Chicago, Governor State University, or Malcolm X College are eligible to apply.

This is a 10-week program, taking place **June 5 - August 11**, 2023, on the University of Illinois Chicago campus. Participating students can expect to commit up to 40 hours per week, and will receive a **\$5,000** stipend. Applications will be open through **February 13th**, with priority until **January 31st**, 2023.

\*Underrepresented groups in biomedical research as defined by NIH include individuals from certain racial/ethnic backgrounds, with disability, or from disadvantaged backgrounds. More details in the application.

**What:** Paid summer experience working in cancer research.

**Who:** Underrepresented UIC, GSU, and Malcolm X students interested in careers in research and healthcare.

**When:** ~40 hours per week, June 5 - August 11, 2023. Priority applications due January 31, 2023.

**Where:** The University of Illinois Chicago Campus.
