Department of Nursing Special Admission Requirements

In addition to meeting university admissions criteria, applicants must:

- Have a baccalaureate degree with a major in Nursing from an accredited nursing program in a regionally-accredited college or university;
 - Have completed the following undergraduate courses or their equivalent: Nursing Research, Nursing Health Assessment and Statistics:
- Have a current and valid license as a registered professional nurse;
- Have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher in all undergraduate courses and a GPA of 3.0 or higher with a grade of "C" or better in all upper-division nursing courses.

Applicants who do not meet the GPA requirements or who have graduated from nongraded baccalaureate programs may be conditionally admitted. A GPA of 3.0 must be maintained for the first nine hours of work completed. If a 3.0 GPA is not maintained, the student must petition the Nursing program for continued enrollment. Applicants with degrees from countries other than the United States must have their international transcripts evaluated by a NACES

(http://www.naces.org/members.html) approved agency. Applicants must assume all responsibility for fees associated with testing and evaluating. All required credentials must be on file in the Office of Admissions before an applicant can be admitted to the program.

Other Requirements

Once accepted into the program, information regarding health and other program specific requirements will be sent to the student. These requirements must be met prior to enrollment.

Degree Requirements

Students must meet all university requirements for a master's degree. In addition, students must:

 During the last semester of the program, pass a comprehensive examination and/or presentation over the major area of study as determined by faculty. This examination/ presentation will be evaluated by graduate faculty. It may be repeated only once.

- A student must earn a grade of B or better in all clinical courses. Student may repeat ONLY ONE (1) nursing course in which a grade of "C" or below is received. A second "C" or below will result in dismissal from the program.
- Complete NEIL Practicum 540.0 Hours.

Students who have focused research interests or who intend to pursue doctoral study may wish to conduct formal thesis/project research. After achieving candidacy, students may begin by registering for NURS 8900 (one hour). A minimum of three hours is required. More information about this option is available from the academic advisor.

Disclaimer: Upon completion and graduation from the MSN, NEIL Program, it's advisable to take the ANCC - Board Certification Exams for Nurse Executive (NE-BC) and Nurse Executive Advanced (NEA-BC) fulfulling two (2) years or 2000 hours of work experience as a nurse leader.
