Course Offering and Design

Time: evenings (except field experiences)

Modality: online synchronous (at a scheduled time), online asynchronous, face-to-face (intro courses & field experiences)

Design: Most program courses are designed in three 1-credit hour modules (5 weeks each).

Candidates may be eligible to earn credit for prior learning and experience for some courses modules. To do this, candidates must pass an exam (Prior Learning Assessment - PLA) for each modularized course at the end of the semester before taking the course. The exam and completed forms must be completed during a certain time period.

Field Experiences: There are opportunities for job-embedded field experiences for the 4 clinical field experience courses and student teaching. Candidates may be eligible if the criteria for approved schools and for each course are met, as well as the requirements for job-embedded field experiences.

Forms must be completed by the given date or candidates may not be able to do job-embedded field experiences.

Program Start: fall start only

Course Schedule: ECE program courses are only offered once a year.

Some courses have prerequisites that are required to be followed (i.e. courses must be taken in order).
