Analysis of Results	 Fall orientation was done in PP Classroom, RA of international wing was in attendance, Spring orientation was revamped to have students attend tours and presentations in office/department spaces instead of one location (student were able to make direct connections with employees of each office). AD met with Director of OIS to establish/share Housing Policies and suggestions for orientation
