Goal 4: Enhance academic support resources and facilities to serve students as all levels (undergraduate and graduate) and modes (on campus, online, and hybrid) of instruction.

Objective 1:	Collaboration with other departments, centralizing writing services for students located in the Library and Academic Resource Center. (Library, English Department Services, and Writing Services)
Action Items	<p>Utilize various facilities in partnership with the Library and Writing Department as central locations to provide writing and research assistance to all division students.</p> <p>Library</p> <p>Writing Center will continue to partner with Library to house Writing services in the Library and offer workshops in the Library, if warranted.</p> <p>Writing Department</p> <p>The Writing Center Coordinator is collaborating with Writing faculty to implement Creative Writing course(s). The Coordinator is scheduled to teach Writing courses in Fall 2018 and Spring 2019. Furthermore, the Writing Center Coordinator serves on the WAC Advisory Board and the Composition Steering Committee. The WAC Advisory Board plans to examine writing objectives across the various disciplines. These findings will help the Writing Center assist students with course writing expectations. The charge of the Composition Steering Committee is to examine English Smart Start, ENGL 1000, and ENGL 1010 courses and their effectiveness.</p>

Tutors will be installed in the library at regular shifts to answer students' questions and direct them toward additional services.

Objective 2:	Extend support services to address students' needs by offering services/workshops in other facilities on campus. (ARC, Cube, classrooms, departments, and Prairie Place)
Action Items	ARC-Math, Science, and Business Assistance Extend support services by offering online math resources and workshops; host workshops in the Cube; and offer ARC support in classrooms, such as supplemental instruction and learning strategies support; and Prairie Place. ARC will continue to offer Math assistance in the Math Department, if warranted. A new Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP) resource/practice page will be added to the ARC Student Success page and available to all GSU students who are preparing for this test. Writing Center The Writing Center will extend services in the Library and conduct classroom presentations such as Smart Start and graduate/upper division courses. In addition, the Writing Center will accommodate students during all hours of the business day with optimum scheduling face-to-face appointments occurring Wednesday through Friday from 3:00pm – 7:00 pm.

Achieved Outcomes and Results	<p>ARC-Math, Science, and Business</p> <p>Due to lack of student interest, we suspended walk-in (math) tutoring services at Prairie Place during the fall 2018 term and did not continue into spring 2019. We will certainly reevaluate for fall 2019. We collaborated with Dean Lydia Morrow-Ruetten on the semi-annual Library Jam with four tutors participating during the fall term. We did not participate during the spring term due to lack of students visiting during the fall Library Jam. Our former graduate tutor (Patrick) was available in the CUBE during Smart Start to assist students in setting up their My Math Lab and My Stat Lab programs. A new Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP) math practice page was added to the ARC student success page. The TAP Exam was discontinued by the state on 6-30-2019.</p> <p>Writing Center</p> <p>Due to conflicts in various tutors' schedules, the Writing Center offered hours at the library desk at different times on different days. However, this approach benefited GSU students, offering them a sliding schedule to times they could visit the desk and receive assistance. The Writing Center plans to continue this practice in the 2019-20 academic year.</p>

Tutoring services were utilized in all locations; therefore, the math center will continue to provide services in the Library, Cube, and Prairie Place. 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<p>Achieved Outcomes and Results</p>	<p>ARC-Math, Science, and Business</p> <p>The three action items that the Math Center needs to accomplish are listed below, along with what we did (or are doing) to accomplish them during AY 2018 – 2019 (or in AY 2019 – 2020).</p> <p>CRLA Level 1 Certification</p> <p>The application for Level 1 certification was submitted in late July 2018 and we were finally approved in March 2019. During that time, we had 6 tutors complete the requirements for level 1 certification. With the assistance of our returning tutors, we hope to submit an application for level 2 certification along with our level 1 renewal.</p> <p>Implement math resource workshops</p> <p>Calculator and Stat Crunch workshops are sporadically offered and usually see 1 or 2 students in attendance. As part of our CRLA Certification, we are completing a major revision of the former Study Skills with Patrick workshops. Tutors who have already completed level 1 certification will present a workshop centered on 1 or 2 study skills topics throughout the Fall 2019 semester. This may also serve as a project for the prospective level 2 application.</p> <p>Additional Supplemental Instruction (SI)</p> <p>Resume offering SI in as many lower division math courses as possible and support organic chemistry 1 and 2 at the upper division during AY 2019 – 2020.</p> <p>Writing Center</p> <p>Although few Pathways students voluntarily sought assistance in the Writing Center, plans for more aggressive outreach to this population are in the works. This includes encourage instructors to make more student referrals to the Writing Center.</p> <p>Academic Resource Center</p> <p>During AY 18.19, 0 students attended the 16 GSU STAR open labs, facilitated by the GSU STAR Graduate Assistant. The open labs were promoted each week in the “This Week in the SSC” e-blasts. In addition, students who received midterm alerts were sent GSU STAR referrals for tutoring; however, not many students responded to the referrals/communication</p>

Implications for AY19 Objectives.)</p>	<p>The math center has provided and increased utilization in math workshops and supplemental instruction support. We hope to have improved attendance in our calculator, Stat Crunch, and study skills workshops in AY 19.20.</p> <p>Writing Center</p> <p>In the coming year, the Writing Center will strive to make learners aware of the support it can provide. It is particularly important that learners seek support in the Writing Center early in their coursework and to integrate regular visits to the Writing Center into their academic careers. New and sustained partnerships with various departments within the GSU structure can aid in achieving this goal.</p> <p>Academic Resource Center</p> <p>For AY 19.20, GSU STAR information sessions will be implemented in every Mastering College course, facilitated by the NSP peer mentor. Peer mentors will do an overview on GSU STAR, show students how to access it, discuss the importance of connect and early alert system, and have students complete an Intake survey in GSU STAR. In addition, the GSU STAR Success Team is changing the message templates in flags to an action plan format. Instead of students receiving a flag stating the concern, the message will now tell the student action steps on what they need to do.</p>
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
