Introduction to Grants at CDC

FY 2024 Grant Statistics

Managed 5,501 grant awards to 2,482 recipients that generated 15,226 actions

Obligated \$8.06 billion dollars into public health programs and research in the U.S. and around the world

Published 105 new Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFOs)

Financial Assistance and Acquisition Mechanisms

Grant	 Provide federal funding to assist public health stakeholders in accomplishing a public purpose
Cooperative Agreement	 Type of grant Used where there will be substantial involvement from CDC staff including, but not limited to: Requiring approvals before undertaking the next phase of a project Approving proposed subaward or contract provisions Coordinating/participating in data collection
Acquisition	 Contracts, purchase orders, or task/delivery orders Acquire goods and services for the direct benefit or use by CDC Services are provided first and then payment follows

Recipient Roles and Responsibilities

- Develops and implements systems and monitoring procedures to ensure proper stewardship of funds
- Identifies areas of special interest and communicates regularly with the CDC Project Officer
- Tracks performance and submits timely reports
- Accounts for its funds to CDC, and is responsible for sub-recipients and subcontractors
- Complies with Terms and Conditions of Award



Pre-Application Information and Tips for Applying

Highlights of Key Pre-Application Steps

Step 1 GET TO KNOW GRANTS.GOV

- Register as soon as possible
- Process includes certification/ verification and takes several days to a week
- See applicant training on grants.gov

Step 2 REGISTER IN SAM.GOV


- System for Award Management (SAM)
- SAM Registration provides applicants with the Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
- Help Desk: (866) 606-8220

Step 3 REVIEW THE NOFO

 When reviewing the NOFO, consider creating a task list and a schedule/timeline to ensure the completion

First Stop: GRANTS.GOV

- A common website for federal agencies to post discretionary funding opportunities
- Allows users to electronically find, apply for, and manage federal grant opportunities securely
- Single access point for over 1,000 grant programs offered by 26 federal granting agencies
- Part of the President's Management Agenda and E-Government Initiatives



SAM.gov is an official website of the United States government. SAM.gov is FREE to use. There is no charge to get a Unique Entity ID, register your entity, and maintain your entity registration at SAM.gov.

The questionnaires and checklists here will help you gather the information you need and prepare to answer the questions in your entity registration.



All Awards registration allows you to bid on contracts and other procurements, as well as apply for financial assistance. Look for the icon on the left to submit an All Awards registration.

Financial Assistance Awards Only registration allows you to apply for financial assistance, or grants and loans, only. Look for the icon on the left to submit a Financial Assistance Only registration.

- Risk Assessment Questionnaire


